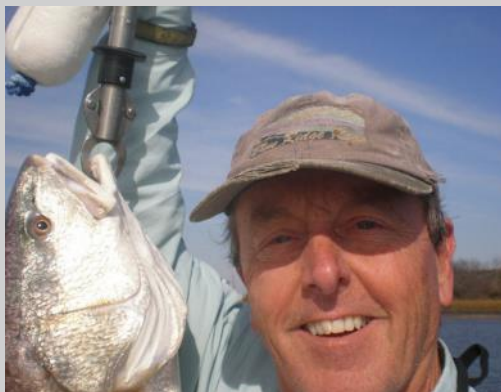

Steinhatchee River Designated Florida's 50th State Paddling Trail

From The Fishing Wire

With the addition of the Steinhatchee River, Florida now has 50 state paddling trails. The Florida Department of Environmental Protection's Office of Greenways & Trails designated the Steinhatchee River during the Taylor County Commission meeting on Sept. 16. The Florida Paddling Trails Association also presented signs designating the communities of Keaton Beach and Steinhatchee as "Blueway Communities."

"We are proud to add the Steinhatchee River as our 50th designated state paddling trail," said Florida State Park Director Donald Forgone. "Designation of the river creates well-deserved recognition of this excellent destination for paddling, fishing and wildlife viewing and will promote sustainable tourism and boost the economy for the local communities."



Steinhatchee Falls

The scenic Steinhatchee River is the latest of Florida's outstanding waterways to be designated a state paddling trail. The river's spring-fed, tea-colored water meanders through a shady corridor of moss-draped trees flanking the river. It widens gradually as it flows through the colorful fishing villages of Steinhatchee and Jena before joining the Gulf of Mexico. The roughly eight-mile designated portion begins just below the historic Steinhatchee Falls, which has been an accessible river crossing for countless travelers through the ages.

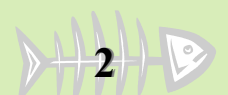
Wagon ruts can still be seen today where Native Americans, Spanish explorers and early settlers crossed the

shallow limestone shelf that creates the low, cascading waterfall. Steinhatchee Falls offers a pleasant picnic area and hand-launch access for small fishing boats, canoes and kayaks. There is also a three-mile, multi-use trail that can be enjoyed by hikers, off-road cyclists and those seeking vibrant seasonal wildflowers and wildlife.

Fishing from a boat or kayak is an interesting prospect for anglers, as both freshwater and saltwater species may be encountered depending upon the stretch of river. Delicious "pan fish" abound in the upper stretches of the Steinhatchee, while saltwater species appear as the river mingles with the Gulf waters. Improved boat ramps on both sides of the river in the towns of Steinhatchee and Jena mark the lower end of the paddling trail and provide good access for all types of boaters.

Visitors are urged to bring binoculars and a camera to capture photos of the wildlife frequently seen along the river corridor and the Gulf coastline. In the fall, colorful monarchs and other butterflies feed upon wildflowers as they migrate southward. Spectacular flocks of white pelicans and other migrating birds are supported by vast tracts of public conservation land that bracket the Steinhatchee River, providing critical habitat for an array of wildlife species inland and along the coastline.

Steinhatchee River Paddling Trail

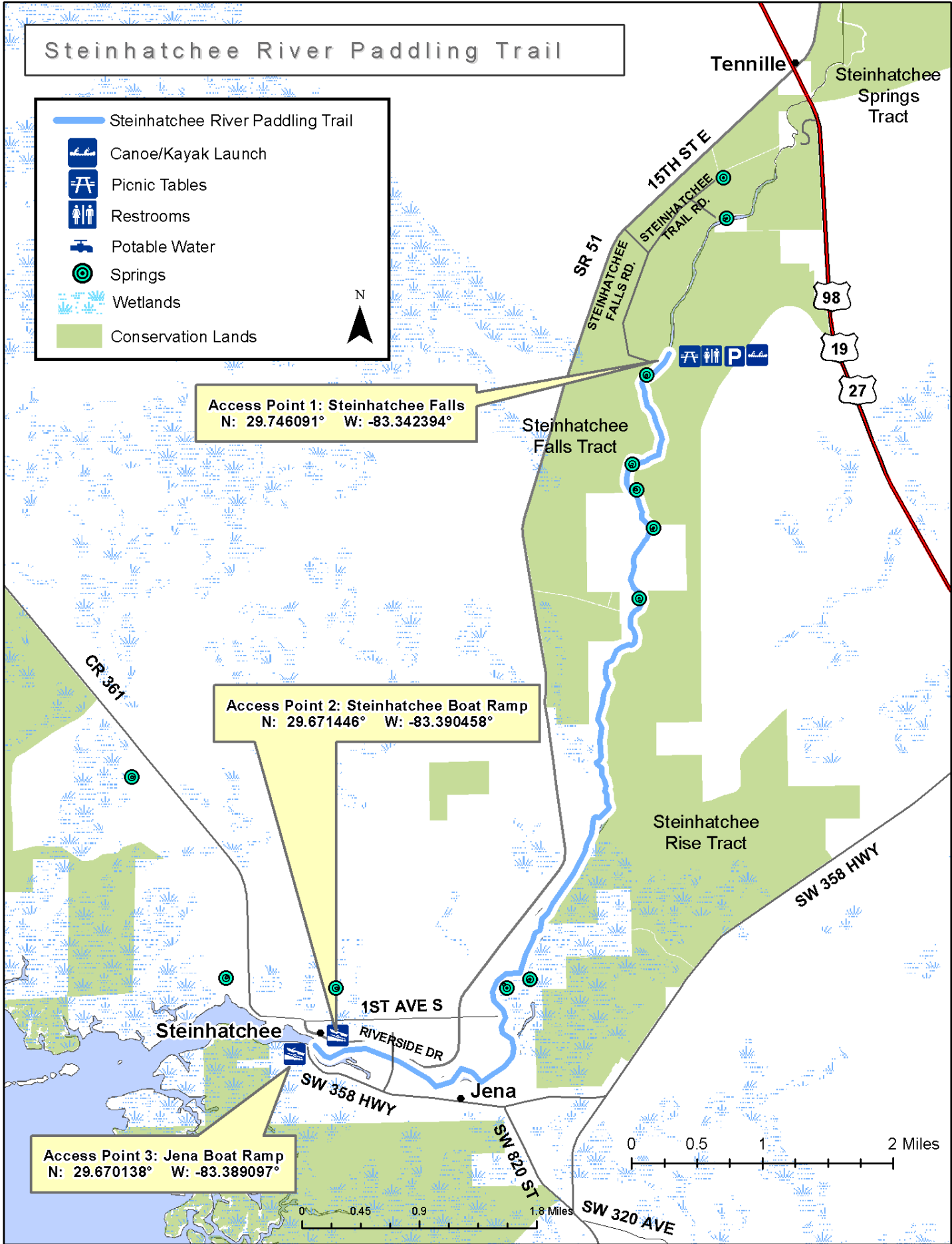

World Renowned Fly Fishers Highlight October's 2014 Florida Fly Fishing Expo in Crystal River

The creator of the Clouser Deep Minnow and the world's first female Master Certified Fly Casting Instructor will lead workshops Oct. 10-11 at The Plantation at Crystal River.

Crystal River, Florida -- Bob Clouser of Clouser Deep Minnow fame and Wanda Taylor, nationally acclaimed fly casting instructor, will each lead four skill-improvement workshops at the 2014 Florida Fly Fishing Expo, Friday and Saturday, October 10-11, 2014, at The Plantation on Crystal River.

The event is sponsored by the non-profit Florida Council of the International Federation of Fly Fishers (IFFF-FL). Tom Gadacz, president of IFFF-FL said, 'These special workshops augment nearly 50 fly fishing clinics, classes, and related programs scheduled for the two-day event; all of which are conducted by professional guides, acclaimed fly casting instructors, and exhibition fly tyers – and most are free with a \$10 entry fee.'

Specialty programs include free clinics in outdoor photography by Nikon Pro Staffer Tom Dunkerton, Fly Fishing from Kayaks by acclaimed illustrator and author Joe Mahler; building a working first aid kit for beach and boat by fly casting instructor Dr. Tom Dempsey; and many programs targeting how-to, when to, and where to catch fish on the fly in the state and region by many of the state and region's best guides.

In addition to the programs and clinics, many of fly fishing's top manufacturers and retailers are scheduled to exhibit new fly rods, reels, lines, clothing, kayaks and other gear and exhibit.

The 2014 Florida Fly Fishing Expo is a family-friendly event that focuses on fly fishing education and resource appreciation. Admission to the family-friendly Expo is \$10, for two days. Kids 16 and younger are free when accompanied by an adult.

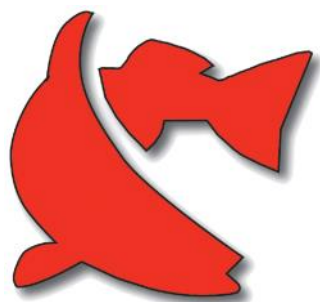

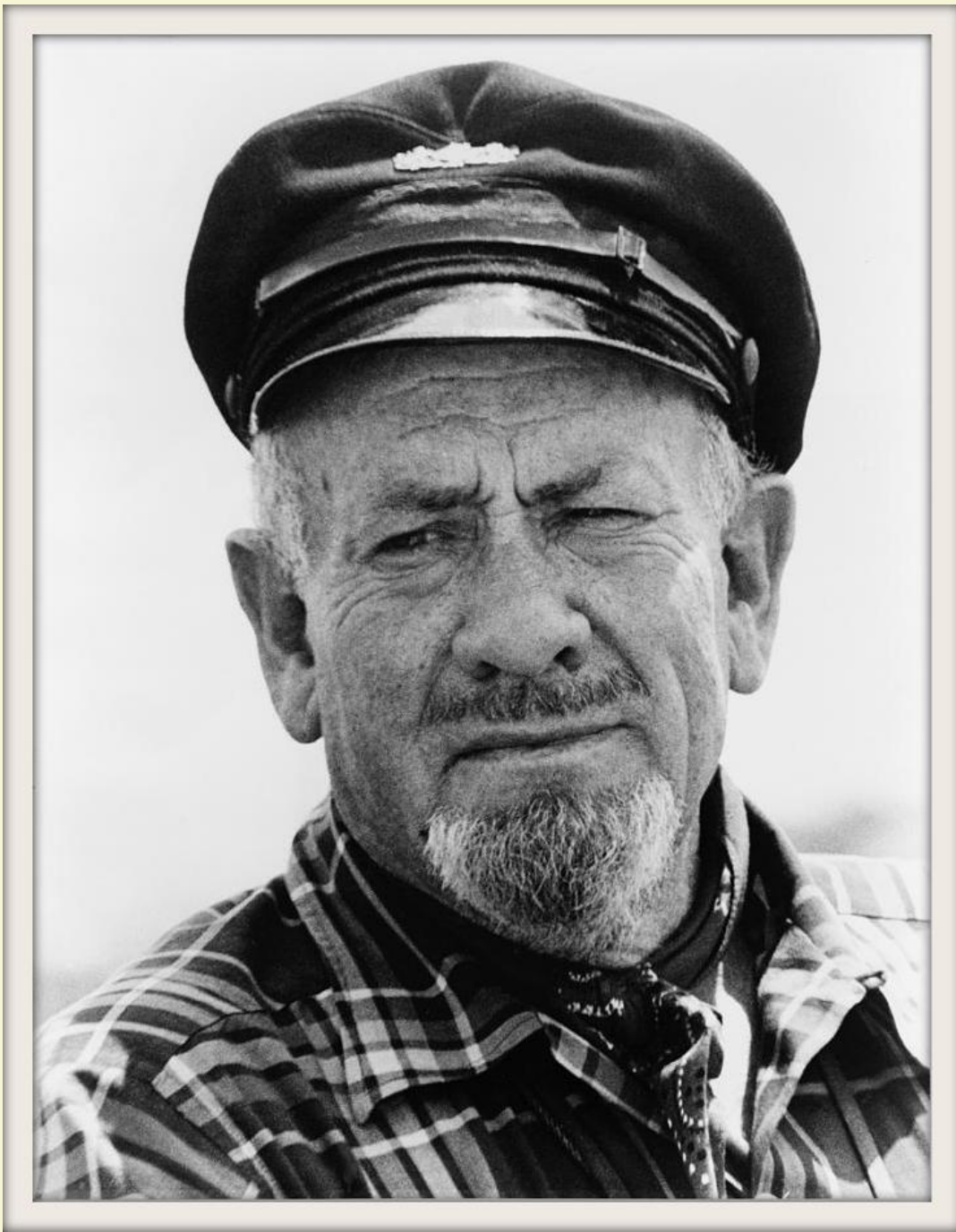

American Fly Fishing Trade Association Position Statement on Magnuson Steven's Act and H.R. 4742

Bozeman, MT – The House Committee on Natural Resources introduced H.R. 4742, the Strengthening Fishing Communities and Increasing Flexibility in Fisheries Management Act, in late 2013. The bill is poised for a vote this session. H.R. 4742 eviscerates many of the Magnuson-Stevens Conservation and Fishery Management Act's 2007 reauthorization's strongest conservation provisions:

- Removes reasonable rebuilding timelines that allows marine species to recover from years of overfishing;
- Shifts Annual Catch Limits that maintain fishing efforts at sustainable levels from annual quotas to multi-year quotas that would threaten opportunity and management stability;
- Hinders the recovery of the Endangered Species Act-listed resources, such as salmon and steelhead.

H.R. 4742 does not reflect the conservation ethos that defines the character of the fly fishing industry and its natural resources-dependent community.

Since 2000, when a federal court decision required the National Marine Fisheries Service to comply with the conservation and stock rebuilding provisions of the Magnuson-Stevens Act, and with new mandates included in the Act's 2007 reauthorization, 34 previously overfished populations have been rebuilt, and the number of populations subject to overfishing has been reduced by more than 60%, from 72 to 28.

Changing any of the Act's provisions now, just as so many of our nation's marine resources are on the cusp of recovery, is unwarranted and threatens to send us back to the days of overfishing when opportunity was severely limited because of a lack of healthy fish populations.

The American Fly Fishing Trade Association—the nation's sole fly fishing trade association—will be devel-



oping recommendations for reauthorization of the Magnuson-Stevens Conservation and Fishery Management Act and will share those recommendations with Congress as the reauthorization process moves forward.

this is a chance to reconnect with Bob and learn some new tying and casting tricks sure to improve your success.

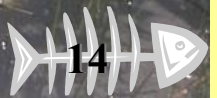
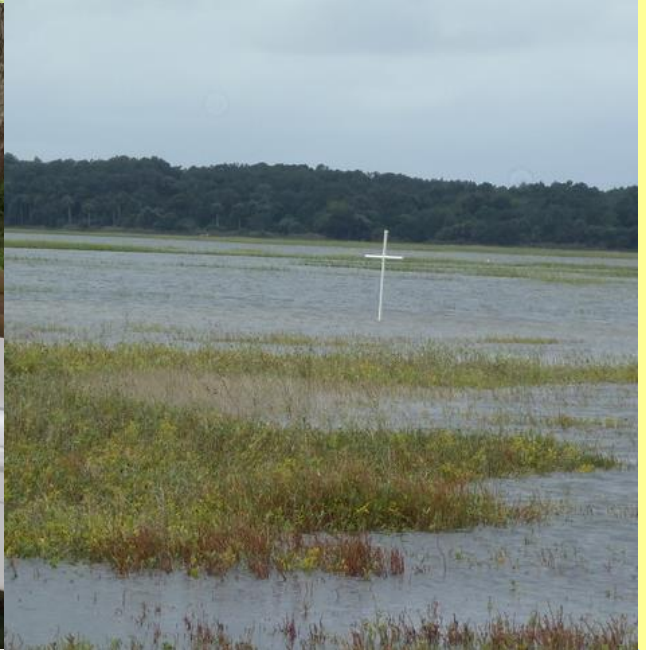

1. Where are you originally from and how long have you lived in the Golden Isles?

Brevard North Carolina as a Child, Augusta GA teens, Athens, GA for almost 30 years. In St. Simons Island, going on 6 years full-time, 40 years part-time.

2. What is your job/profession?

Fly Fishing Guide and Consultant to Pieles Temola, Morelos, Mexico

3. Tell us a little something about your family?

I have three beautiful daughters, all grown now, who were spread out by many years. When they were young, people asked me why I went hunting and fishing so much. 8. Aside from the obvious (rod, reel and flies) what piece of fly fishing gear do you consider essential to have with you on the water?

I am not much of a gear head, I am more of a minimalist. Probably a good pair of clippers would be an essential item.

9. What is your "go-to" fly?

Red Fish Black Toad

10. What is your favorite fish to catch on a fly rod?

Wild Brown Trout and Redfish

11. If they made a movie about your life, what would the Title be and what actor would play You?

"He Stumbled Through Life Having a Good Time." I would be the stumbler.

12. What is the last book you read?

I don't read much

Breast Cancer Statistics

- ◆ About 1 in 8 U.S. women (about 12%) will develop invasive breast cancer over the course of her lifetime.
- ◆ About 2,360 new cases of invasive breast cancer were expected to be diagnosed in men in 2014. A man's lifetime risk of breast cancer is about 1 in 1,000.
- ◆ For women in the U.S., breast cancer death rates are higher than those for any other cancer, besides lung cancer.
- ◆ Besides skin cancer, breast cancer is the most commonly diagnosed cancer among American women. Just under 30% of cancers in women are breast cancers.
- ◆ About 85% of breast cancers occur in women who have no family history of breast cancer. These occur due to genetic mutations that happen as a result of the aging process and life in general, rather than inherited mutations.
- ◆ In 2014, there were more than 2.8 million women with a history of breast cancer in the U.S. This includes women currently being treated and women who have finished treatment.
