



He has been a professional fly casting and fly tying instructor for over 25 years and is the founder of the longest established flyfishing school in the South. Jon has taught thousands of students and trained guides at various international locations. Jon's credentials include an

M.S. Degree in Natural Resources with special concentration in fisheries. He is a member of the Team Sage Advisory Staff, Rio Advisory Staff, Team Tibor, and Umpqua 's Contract Tyer Program. Jon also serves as a consultant for several fly-fishing related products including Heritage Kayaks. His articles, casting tips, and photographs have been featured in most major fly fishing publications. Jon and David will discuss and demonstrate techniques for making fundamental changes to your cast that will increase distance and accuracy. The fly must be an original pattern. The pattern may be a variation of an existing fly pattern. However, there must be a substantial difference between the original pattern and the variant. Note: changing the color scheme of the pattern is not considered a substantial variation from the original pattern.

Twenty Questions with... David Lambert, Master Casting Instructor



1. Where are you originally from and how long have you lived in the Jacksonville-Area?

My family was from Louisville, KY. I was born in Atlanta. My grandparents moved to Florida in the 40s, to Punta Gorda, then Boca Raton. My folks moved to Jacksonville in 1955; the Beaches in 1962.

2. What is your profession?

I'm a schooled writer and editor; that's been my main vocation. Right now I'm editing The Loop, an international journal for professional fly casters and casting instructors. I like to work with my hands, I like to build, like working outside. I've been fixing homes for four decades (mostly for my family and mostly at the Beach). I started teaching fly casting in 1996 and have done quite a bit of that professionally, although it's mostly avocation.

3. Tell us a little something about your family?

I'm married to Annie Lambert, been together since 1978. She's a teacher, autistic kids and kids who need extra attention. Two sons, Pete and Geoff -both grown. Pete's an IT guy for Marker 32, North Beach Fish Camp and the others in that group. He fixes phones and laptops, too. He wants to also get a nursing degree. Geoff's a semi-pro skateboarder and surfer. An active guy. He fishes three times a week. Usually backcountry. Both good guys who've carved their own niches. We have a dog, Stella, a runt nebolish mastiff -- mix of boxer and English mastiff. A sweet dog with a wanky jaw and an exposed tongue that can carry full pine needles at times.

4. How long have you been fly fishing?

I can't remember not fishing, from local piers with my Granny to pulling seines in front of our house. Flyfishing? Exclusively since the mid 90s, but I flyfished since I was a teen every summer in Northern Wisconsin. We vacationed at my uncle's place in the North Woods, Paul Bunyan country. It had a trout stream wandering through the property. I was really excited to find guys like John Bottko and Randy Lanier and Lee Hinrichs who were doing it in the salt.

5. Who are your heroes or who do you admire most?

I don't really have conventional heroes. I admire altruism, people who gives back, who walk the walk. I admire independent thinkers and inventers. I admire tinkerers and piddlers; there aren't enough them these days. I admire anyone who has the curiosity to put down the electronics and pick up a tool, a pencil, a musical instrument or an artist's brush and wonder, 'Can I make something with this? Or, how does this thing work?'

6. Where is your favorite place to fish?

second-growth forests. I admire most waters, especially when I'm fishing them. I love my river in North Florida. That's where I fish mostly these days.

7. With what person (living or dead) would you like to spend a day on the water?

Gary Borger, Jim Green. Joe Brooks. Actually, I love to fish with my buddy Dick Michaelson.

8. Aside from the obvious (rod, reel and flies) what piece of fly fishing gear do you consider essential to have with you on the water?

These days, reading glasses, then a hemostat with built-in scissors and an hook-eye cleaner. Stream Works make one, so does Orvis, I think.

9. What is your "go-to" fly?

Probably a Clouser type or a bendback. I like simple flies. Cold water? The standard Adams variant, BWOs or sulphurs, pheasant tails, hare's ears, woolly buggers.

10. What is your favorite fish to catch on a fly rod.

Smallies, smallmouth bass. And I love false albies, but I don't target them much.

11. If they made a movie about your life, what would the title be and what actor would play you?

You Should've Been Here Yesterday, starring Casey Affleck, Ben's younger and more talented brother, or Gary Sinese.

12. What is the last book you read?

I read a couple at a time: I've just finished *The Trouble with Poetry*, by Billy Collins; *The Naked and The Dead*, Mailer; and *An Army At Dawn*, a Pulitzer winner by Rick Atkinson. I'm reading *Beyond the Hundredth Meridian* by Wallace Stegner, *Gill Net Games*, one of four by St. Augustine writer and fly guy M.W. Gordon; and *10th Anniversary of Calvin and Hobbes* (with annotation by Bill Watterson).

13. What is on your iPod (i.e. what kind of music do you listen to)?

I listen to different stuff sort of cyclically, pretty much all music except for pop and rap. I like real country (not the Nashville stuff), 40s stuff, swing, jazz, good rock, folk, texas/country. I like the singers-songwriters, too, and classical. I have a fair classical library. Been revisiting John Hiatt and Guy Clark recently. And Amy Winehouse. And some old Neil Young.

14. How may fly rods do you own?



A lot, dozens likely. Haven't counted in awhile.

15. What is your favorite guilty pleasure?

I spend too much time on social media.

16. What is your idea of a perfect day on the water?

I'm not too picky about where I fish or what I fish for. My perfect day would include a couple of decent fish, lots of nature, and a couple good friends. It would be punctuated by a day's end -- firelight oranging on treebark, a good dog laying around somewhere, and a few sets of feet pointed toward the heat, with steam coming from the socks. Conversation. Laughter.

17. Which talent or skill would you most like to have?



St. Johns River Reef Project

JACKSONVILLE, FL - It is not often that the downtown area of a U.S. city is the backdrop for a new reef, but that is exactly where the next marine habitat project funded by Coastal Conservation Association Florida (CCA Florida) and the CCA national marine habitat program will splash down. Two new fishing reefs have been created less than half a mile from the I-95 Bridge over the St. Johns River in downtown Jacksonville

The total cost of the project is \$60,000 and the Jacksonville Chapter of CCA Florida has committed to raising 50 percent of the necessary funding. The Building Conservation Trust, CCA's national habitat program which has garnered support from country music star Kenny Chesney and Costa Sunglasses among others, has donated the remaining \$30,000 to the Jacksonville reefing project.

"Costa asked me what I wanted to do with the money raised through our sunglasses last year, and I told them I'd like what we do to be something that renews the waterways, so people can enjoy them the way so many of my friends and fans do," said Chesney. "To protect the oceans, bays and rivers is our responsibility - and I'm glad we can make a difference in the St. John River."

"It is a unique opportunity to create some valuable marine habitat in a place where the public has unparalleled access," said Payton Scheppe, a CCA Florida volunteer who has spearheaded the project. "This is an area of the river where an amazing variety of fish can be found depending on the time of year, right here in the shadow of high-rise office buildings. What a great place to introduce people to marine conservation and to recreational angling."

The effort to place two reefs, each roughly 200 feet by 200 feet, in the St. Johns River has attracted widespread support. The City of Jacksonville has embraced the idea and has handled all the permitting requirements for the reefs. Among the volunteers working for the habitat enhancement is the former chairman of the Florida Fish and Wildlife Commission, Kathy Barco. The deployment will consist of more than 25,000 cubic feet of concrete rubble will be placed in each of the two sites.

"The material is going to be carefully arranged so that there will be no issues with clearance from the surface, but there will be areas with three to four feet of relief from the bottom intermixed with open spaces to create an ideal habitat for fish," said Scheppe. "The area now is basically just an open sandbar so the transformation is going to be fascinating."

Taking advantage of the opportunity to study the development of an artificial reef habitat right in its own backyard, Jacksonville University has announced it will study the reefs over the next two years to gauge the impact of the structures on the surrounding area.

"Our members love to fish and they make it a point of pride to give something back to the resource so that others can enjoy it, too," said Charles Holt, another CCA volunteer working on the project. "This is perhaps the most unique habitat project we've ever been part of, and we hope the people of Jacksonville will come take advantage of it."

Originally, the Club planning to fish the lower St Johns River this month for shad. However, circumstances beyond our are preventing us from doing so. So, we are switching to Plan B.

The first outing of 2015 will be held at Cedar Point on Saturday, January 31st. We fished Cedar Point several times last year during the flood tides. However, this time we will be fishing the low tide, which is at noon. Depending on how long you want to spend on the water, you will have an excellent opportunity to fish both the incoming and outgoing tides. Best of all, you don't need to get up at o'dark-thirty to do it. If you want to fish the outgoing tide, plan to be on the water between 9:30 and 10:00 AM.

The cold weather has killed off the algae so the water

should be relatively clear. As a result, the fish will be spooky. Small shrimp and minnow will be the order of the day. Foxtail Clousers tied with 1/60 or 1/40 oz. eyes will be ideal. The fish will likely be schooling on the mud flats. Chances are you will only get one or two shots at the school before the fish scatter. So limit your false casting and make your casts count.

Plan to join us after the outing at the Cedar Point boat ramp for hamburgers and hot dogs.

If you'd like to participate in the outing please contact Jeff Bivins at <u>outings@fcff.org</u> so he can get a headcount for the BBQ. If you do not have a boat and want to participate in the outing, Jeff will make sure you can join one of the other participants.
