

### WORLD-RENOWN FLY TYER BOB CLOUSER VISITS THE FIRST COAST FLY FISHERS

**B**ob Clouser is one of the best-known names in fly fishing and has been a frequent visitor to the First Coast Fly Fishers. When he found himself in Florida in December for the Renzetti Fly Fishing Fair, he contacted the Club to see if we would be interested in having him come up for a day of casting and tying. The Club jumped on the offer and President Robert Benardo immediately and set up an outing with Bob.

The afternoon started with burgers and dogs cooked up by our own Top Chef Mike Harrigan. He would custom cook anything as rare or burned as you wanted it! After our BBQ feast, Bob gave a presentation on fishing that had everyone ready to go chase Smallmouth Bass.

Afterward, Bob demonstrated just how easy it is to cast a fly line (easy for him anyway.....this author is still trying to figure out what kind of magic fly line he was using). He began by demonstrating that the cast is a matter of simple physics broken down into the acceleration and deceleration of the rod tip, the flex of the rod and the position of the caster's body. He also showed a technique of determining just how much or little power it takes to cast a fly line by starting with too little energy (acceleration) to cast the full line and how the increase in the energy applied to

the cast is proportional to the distance the line travels. His point was that you don't have to try to overpower the cast. Instead, it is a matter of applying the right amount of energy to cast the line the desired distance. After his demonstration, Bob spent time with each club member that wanted some one-on-one casting assistance.

At the end of the presentation, Bob demonstrated how to tie his famous Clouser Minnow. This is possibly one of the most effective fly patterns created for fresh or saltwater. When you tie it Bob's way, is incredibly simple. 
**T**aking over the reigns as newsletter editor will be Past-President Jason Sheasley. While David is stepping-down from


